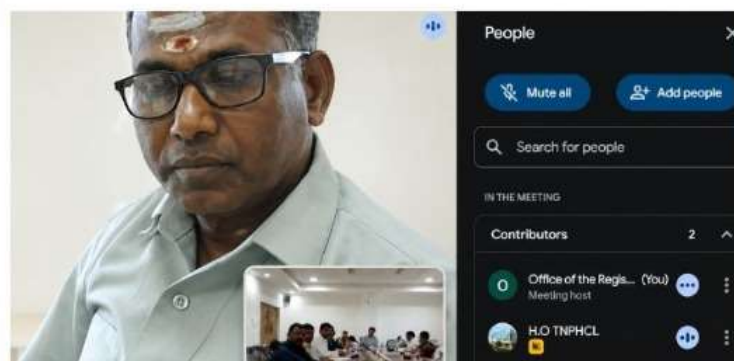

23 January 2026 | National Voter's Day

Continuing Medical Education (CME) Programme

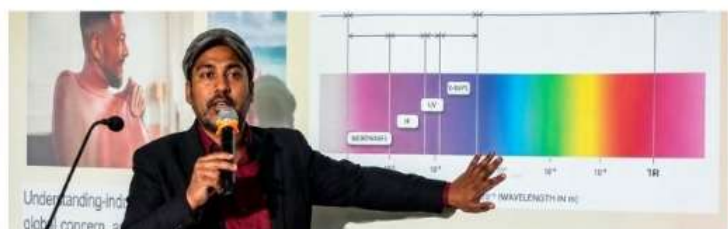
28 January 2026 | CME on Environmental Pollution and Lung Health

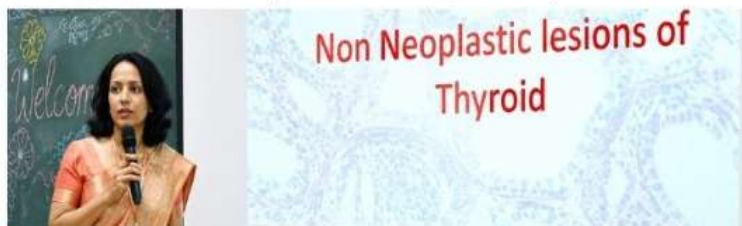
10 July 2026 | CME on Pharmacology
